Township To Receive American Rescue Act Funds

Through a state program, Will County has received \$134M in Covid relief funds and has allocated \$67,179 to Washington Township. Supervisor Stanula attended a session last June to learn about the program's compliance requirements. After the session, Stanula submitted an application for a new freezer for the township Food Pantry, installing "touch-less" water faucets and toilets controls at both the Washington Township Center and Community Hall and finally, upgrading the HVAC system at the Washington Township Community Building.

The Township received approval for the requested projects in February and will receive approximately \$67,000 in grants to pay for the work. This is a reimbursement program that requires the recipient to pay for the project out of their own funds and then submit a reimbursement form. There was no indication how long the reimbursement process will take but the township has until 2026 to complete the projects. The townships 2023-2024 budget will include these expenditures.

Three bids are required for all projects over \$10,000 and they do not have to be sealed bids. The Community Building Board of Managers will begin investigating the options to upgrade the HVAC system and the Township Board will request bids / quotes for the freezer and bathroom updates. All work labor required will follow the provisions of the IL Prevailing Wage Act.

Washington Township Center Roof To Be Replaced

The Washington Township Center is in need of a new roof over the townships 5,000 square foot office space. The building, which was built in 2002, was a result of the cooperation, vision and combined resources of the Village of Beecher, Washington Township Road District, Washington Township and the Beecher Community School District.

The current roof is comprised of metal roofing installed directly over metal roof supports. Over time, the metal roof has expanded and contracted and has started to leak in various areas. Supervisor Stanula, an architect by trade, has received a preliminary roofing proposal, which includes three options to repair the roof.

- "Option 1" is to repair any loose screws and then spray the existing roof with a sealer at a cost of \$48,000
- "Option 2" is to replace the roof with a "standing seam" metal roof at a cost of \$140,000
- "Option 3" is to remove the metal roof and install a shingle roof utilizing architectural shingles at a cost of \$53,000.

The Board discussed the options and spraying the roof with sealer was not considered a viable solution and the cost of the standing seam roof was excessive. A decision was made to have the roof replaced with a shingled roof.

Supervisor Stanula has written the bid specifications, and Bid Requests have been published in the local papers. The project will require sealed bids and the vendor must pay prevailing wages.

Beecher Farmer's Market Returns

The Beecher Farmer's Market returns for 2023 in the Beecher Village Hall parking lot at 625 Dixie Highway.

The first market will be held on Saturday, May 13 and continue on the second and fourth Saturdays of the month, through October. The market is open from 9 am to 1 pm.

Assessor Pat Peters has announced that the Will County Supervisors of Assessment's Office will be offering assistance to Washington Township residents on May 25 from 10 am to 2 pm to assist seniors in completing their exemption forms. Along with Pat, Will County officials and former Assessor Mary Tamez will be assisting with the application process. No appointments are necessary and residents will be assisted on a first come first serve basis.

Disabled persons exemptions are also renewable at this time. Beware of IRS Phone Scams

With the 2022 tax season nearly over, the IRS reminds seniors to remain alert to aggressive and threatening phone calls by criminals impersonating IRS agents. The callers claim to be IRS employees and sound very convincing but are **NOT**.

The truth is the IRS or its authorized agencies will NEVER:

- **Call** to demand immediate payment using a specific payment method such as a prepaid debit card, gift card or wire transfer. The IRS does not use these methods for tax payments. Generally, the IRS will first mail a bill to any taxpayer who owes taxes.
- Threaten to immediately bring in local police or other law enforcement groups to have the taxpayer arrested for not paying.
- **Demand** that taxes be paid without giving the taxpayer the opportunity to question or appeal the amount owed.
- **Ask** for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.

If you ever receive one of these calls, REMEMBER:

Never give out personal information and hang-up immediately!

Community Hall News!


The Washington Township Community Hall has been a busy place! From virtually being shut down during the most challenging times of the Covid-19 pandemic, practically every weekend and several weeknights are now booked for the next few months!

However, the Hall continues to accept rental applications from any Washington Township resident. It is a great location for birthday parties, baby showers, bridal showers, graduation parties and much more! The standard fee is \$125 per day per level. Weekends fill up quickly, so we encourage anyone interested in seeing the building or reserving a date to contact Kellie Karstensen, Community Hall Manager at 708-417-6403 to check availability and details.

Due to the increased use and condition the Hall has been left in after various functions, we have started a Cleaning Deposit Policy as of February 1, 2023. There is a refundable \$100 Cleaning Deposit due at the time of booking. The deposit is fully refunded provided all items on the clean-up checklist are completed and after the building is found to be clean and restored to orderly condition with no damages. We have also started using 2-part signature forms explaining the Rental and Cleaning Deposit Policies so that everyone is fully aware of the expectations prior to renting the hall.

The Kicking it Back Center Now Open in Beecher

The Kicking It Back Center recently celebrated its Open House on March 1, 2023.

Kicking It Back, Inc., located at 522 Gould Street in Beecher is a non-profit organization dedicated to improving the lives of young people and senior citizens through mentoring, sports, exercise, activities,

education and fellowship. Since their founding, Kicking It Back has served over 700 children and young adults and typically serve between 50 and 60 youth each year with a staff of many dedicated volunteers. The organization is fully funded through donations and fund raising activities.

Established in 2006, Kicking It Back was founded by Beecher resident Juan Hernandez, who is a 7th degree black belt in Shorei Ryu karate, world karate champion, five-time National Karate Champion and has received numerous other awards and accolades. Hernandez is also the founder of Alicia's House, which is one of the largest food pantries in the south suburbs and the highly successful Police and Kids Together (PAKT)



Program. Students of Hernández's Martial Arts Program have won three World Championships and 75 National Championship Titles with the World Karate Council, American Karate Association and the North American Sport Karate Association. In 2021, three students from the program attended the World Karate Championships, winning one gold medal, five silver medals, and one bronze medal for Team USA. Returning in 2022, two students went to Ireland and won two gold medals, one silver medal and one bronze medal for Team USA.

Kicking It Back's new 11,000 square foot facility now serves as the home to their Martial Arts and PAKT programs, which used the Washington Township Community Building for their programs for many years. Because this building offers more space and due to the need for additional services in our area, Kicking It Back has now added Meemaw's Cozy Corner (located in the same building) for senior programs. Current senior programs, include free exercise classes every Monday & Wednesday from 10:30 - 11:30 am, Bunco on the 2nd Wednesday of the month (1 - 3 pm) and Bingo on the 3rd Wednesday of the month (1 - 3 pm) and more activities being added soon. Kicking It Back provides youth and senior programs, **at no cost**, to residents of Beecher, Crete, Steger, Momence, Monee, Peotone, University Park, Grant Park, South Chicago Heights and the surrounding areas.


UPCOMING TOWNSHIP ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS for 2023


Highway Commissioner Mike Smith has indicated that he will be concentrating on the following projects as construction season starts.

- **♦** Preparing Corning Road for resurfacing from Stoney Island to Yates

Ongoing Maintenance for the Season includes:

- ♦ Asphalt patching as needed

- ♦ Culvert assessments / repair or replace as needed

Springtime Means Planting Season - Safety Tips for Sharing the Road with Farm Equipment

Washington Township is an agricultural township with hundreds of farms within our boundaries. We thank our farmers

for all they do to feed our nation and ask everyone to use caution during the planting season. Farming equipment has become much larger over the years and according to the National Safety Council, approximately 1/3 of fatal tractor accidents occur on public roads. In order to decrease the chance of a collision, motorists should follow these five rules of the road:



- **1. Slow down when you see a piece of agricultural equipment** Most farm equipment is designed to travel at speeds of only 15-25 mph
- **2. Slow-Moving-Vehicle (SMV) signs** SMVs are required for vehicles traveling less than 25 mph.
- **3.** Watch for hand signals Just because a tractor veers right does not mean the operator is pulling over to allow someone to pass. The size of farm equipment often dictates the necessity of wide turns.
- 4. Pass farm equipment cautiously Even when passing safely and legally, the turbulence created by a vehicle may cause the machinery to sway and become unstable. Do not always expect operators to drive their equipment onto the shoulder of the road. Driving with one set of tires on loose-surfaced shoulders substantially increases the risk of overturning.



5. Watch for flashing amber lights - This type of light often marks the top, far right and left of farm equipment. Also watch for reflective tape marking extremities and sides of equipment.

Remember that agricultural operators have a right to drive their equipment on the road. Please be alert and exercise patience when driving near or passing farm equipment on the roadway. Help us to make this year's planting season a safe one!
