

## Beecher Community Mental Health Program Being Developed by Beecher Fire District & Washington Township

The Beecher Fire Protection District, who is always looking for ways to serve the community, is working on establishing a community mental health program. The program is being developed because the Beecher Fire District has seen an increase (as has most local communities) in health related and other psychiatric health 911 calls. The problem is the fire department transports mental health care calls to area care centers and in many cases, the centers don't have the staff, time or expertise to immediately help them, so they recommend patients to county services, which have a long waiting time to see someone. Research has shown the best way to treat mental health issues is to treat them as soon as possible. So, what is the answer?

The district learned about a program started by the Joliet Fire Department, who was experiencing the same problem. The Joliet Fire Department worked hard and developed a training program to help first responders better recognize and communicate with residents with potential mental health issues. They then partnered with "Thriveworks", which is clinician-founded mental health provider, who specialize in mental health therapy and psychiatry. They offer in-person and online care that can typically respond to inquiries within 48-hours. First responders in Joliet began recommending Thriveworks to residents as needed and after one-year, they saw a significant drop in psychiatric calls and suicides in Joliet fell by 50%.

The Beecher Fire District along with the Joliet Fire Department then presented the idea to several local entities a few months ago and asked for feedback. The Washington Township Board was so impressed with the presentation that a dialog began with the Beecher Fire Protection District to develop this program and to finalize how the program will work in the township. Talks have turned into action and early in March members of the fire district and township met with representatives of Thriveworks to start establishing a partnership to provide their expeditious mental health

services for our community. The cost of this program is expected to be around \$3000 a year and Thriveworks services will be available to all residents of the township. If any resident wants to utilize the Mental Health Program directly, they can call (708) 946-6585 ext. 4001 or they can go to Beecher Fire Protection District's website and enter you information. All information provided is confidential!

The ultimate goal of the program is to have mental health services available to township residents regardless of income level or insurance coverage. This will become possible through this partnership, and it is anticipated that the program will be up and running by late spring.

As a footnote, the Joliet program has been so successful that many other local townships and fire districts are also developing the program for their communities. Additionally, Will County is looking to possibly take over the program from the townships and offer it to all the residents of Will County as soon as 2025.

So spring is upon us once again and with that brings warmer weather, the blooming of flowers and trees, baseball and of course spring cleaning. It's out with the old and in with the new. We all know that Hazardous waste such as oil and common household chemicals are harmful to the environment, but what about electronic waste like televisions, cell phones and computers? Electronic waste or E-waste is being produced at rates faster than ever before. Often times electronic waste contains toxic chemicals such as heavy metals and components that should not simply be discarded through traditional disposal. Although not commonly recognized by the consumer, electronics may contain toxic metals such as lead, cadmium or mercury, along with other materials making the importance of proper disposal and recycling imperative to protect our environment. Proper disposal and recycling is the key phrase here. It's true there's often silver, platinum, palladium and gold in our damaged or outmoded electronics, not to mention plastic, glass and other materials that have some scrap value. A licensed and certified recycler will properly dispose of and recycle E-waste so as to not be harmful to our planet. Unlicensed, unscrupulous companies typically export E-waste to 3<sup>rd</sup> world countries, who extract the precious metals from the electronics by using chemicals to melt away the plastic or by burning it away. The metals are then sold on the black market. Not only is this dangerous and unhealthy to the workers but also our ecosystem.

Recycling is not convenient, it takes effort and responsibility, but every little bit helps us all to be good neighbors. *Reuse, Reduce, Recycle*.

#### Township Developing a Beecher Community Calendar Phone App

What's going on in Beecher / Washington Township this week? That's a question which will soon be answered by simply checking your phone. The township recognized that there was no single source to find out what community activities were taking place during any given week without going on to multiple websites. After some discussion, the Board decided to look into a way to help our residents find and support these activities and found a vendor that could help.

The free phone application, which is currently under development, would allow local entities to submit their activity directly through the app. Once approved, the activity would then go live. Anyone with the app could allow "notifications" and they would receive a text message every time an event is added. The township could also allow certain entities the ability to login to the app and add activities as needed. The app can also point to local websites and possibly pull their events directly from their website calendar. Filters on the app would allow users to find activities by group, date or via the apps calendar. The goal is to include as many activities as possible.

The calendar would hopefully include youth & senior activities, community dinners (Church dinners, fish frys, etc.), health events, concerts, farmer's markets, plays, special presentations and many other programs. The app could also be utilized to help organizations who are planning events and want to verify there isn't an event scheduled for the same day or time. The free app will be available on both Apple and Windows based phones. Once the app is completed, the township and other participants will be asked to announce it through their social media outlets.

The Beecher Fire Protection District (who is sponsoring the app with the township), Beecher Lions Club and Beecher Chamber of Commerce and other community groups have all indicated they would participate in the application and the township will approach more organizations once the app is ready for a "test" version.

The township is also planning to send a smaller newsletter out in late May that will include as many local community activities as possible, in case the phone app isn't online by this time.

#### Beware of IRS Phone Scams

With the 2023 tax season nearly over, the IRS reminds seniors to remain alert to aggressive and threatening phone calls by criminals impersonating IRS agents. The callers claim to be IRS employees and sound very convincing but are **NOT**.

## The truth is the IRS or its authorized agencies will NEVER:

- Call to demand immediate payment using a specific payment method such as a prepaid debit card, gift card or wire transfer. The IRS does not use these methods for tax payments. Generally, the IRS will first mail a bill to any taxpayer who owes taxes.
- Threaten to immediately bring in local police or other law enforcement groups to have the taxpayer arrested for not paying.
- **Demand** that taxes be paid without giving the taxpayer the opportunity to question or appeal the amount owed.
- Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.

If you ever receive one of these calls, REMEMBER: Never give out personal information and hang-up immediately!



## Washington Township Senior News

#### The Risk of Alzheimer's Is Lower Than You Think

According to a recent article in the AARP Bulletin, a 2022 Rand Corp study found the percentage of American's 65 and over with dementia, including Alzheimer's fell 30% from 2000 – 2016. In a 2019 study, Alzheimer rates had fallen 13% per decade over the previous 25 years in North America and Europe – a period in time when there were no drugs on the market to treat or prevent the disease. Approximately 75% of Alzheimer's patients have problems with blood vessels in their brain and it is believed that all the work done to prevent heart disease and stroke may have been related to lower risk of dementia and Alzheimer's disease.

In addition to not smoking the following habits are believed to be helpful in lowering the risk to the disease.

- Monitoring your blood pressure and blood sugar and keeping them at a healthy level.
- Exercise! Staying active can reduce all types of dementia by 28% and Alzheimer's by 45%. As always, contact your physician before starting any exercise routine
- Eat more fruit and vegetables!
- Take a multivitamin. (Consult your doctor)
- Take care of your ears and eyes.
- Take care of your mental health. Stress, depression, anxiety and loneliness all increase your risk of dementia. Get help with your mental health issues.
- Get enough sleep! Limit your caffeine intake later in the day and get into a regular bedtime routine. Sleep boosts the brain's ability to flow fluid and wastes out of the brain.

#### Will County Announces Beecher Electronics, Hazardous Waste & Motor Oil Collection Event

#### When: Saturday, May 11 /8 AM - 3 PM at the Washington Township Center

This event offers collection of nearly all types of electronics and household chemicals, hazardous materials and liquids. All participants must make an APPOINTMENT. There is a limit of 2 TVs per vehicle, maximum 15 gallons of paint, and your ID required. This event is open to ALL Will County residents and all residents of any communities partially within Will County.

Will County has implemented an appointment system to improve all participants drop-off experience. The system is intended to provide predictable lines and smoother service and has worked extremely well since 2018.

<u>Electronic Items Accepted include</u>: Televisions (limit 2), Computers, laptops, tablets, notebooks, monitors, printers, copiers, speakers, cameras, video cameras, telephones, answering machines, microwaves, radios, stereos, vacuum cleaners, toaster ovens, blenders (no glass), coffee makers (no glass), power tools, etc.

Household Items Accepted include: All types of paints/stains (limit 15 gallons), Old/Unwanted medication, Paint thinners, Solvents, Drain cleaners, Cleaning products, Rechargeable batteries, Mercury & mercury items, Aerosol paints & pesticides, Lawn & garden chemicals and fertilizers, Used oil, Used oil Filters, Old gasoline, Antifreeze, Automotive/ Boat batteries, Fluorescent light bulbs (limit 15), Compact fluorescent bulbs, Pool chemicals, Driveway Sealer

**Items NOT Accepted include**: Fireworks/ Explosives, Agricultural wastes, Fire extinguishers, Ammunition (check with your local police department), Radioactive material, Institutional wastes, Controlled substances, Alkaline batteries, Business wastes, Regular garbage, Tires, Smoke/CO detectors, Medical waste/Sharps, Gas cylinders, Appliances, Dehumidifiers.





The appointment system will close at midnight on Thursday <u>MAY 9th</u> to allow staff review and vendor arrangements. To Book an Appointment please logon to: <u>WillCountyGreen.com</u> and look for the Beecher Recycling Event.

# Assessment Freeze Help Offered on May 29

Assessor Pat Peters has announced that her office will be offering assistance to Washington Township residents on **May 29 from 10 am to 2 pm** to assist seniors in completing their exemption forms. County workers will be assisting with the application process. No appointments are necessary - first come first serve.

Disabled persons exemptions are also renewable at this time. If you have already received your senior freeze assessment application or if you have not received a form and feel that you qualify, we encourage you to visit the township center for assistance.

#### Are you eligible for a tax exemption?

There are many exemptions that you may qualify for! Call Assessor Peter's office if you qualify for any of the exemptions listed below.

#### **General Homestead Exemption**

•Do you live on the property, a named owner on the deed, and it is your principal residence? You qualify! This exemption is added and removed by our office, there is no form. ALWAYS check your property tax bill to make sure you have it if you qualify.

#### **Disabled Person Exemption**

•Are you collecting disability? You qualify! Please bring in the proof of disability or come to the office to get the form for the doctor to fill out for the proof and we will assist you with the exemption form.

#### **Senior Homestead Exemption**

•Do you turn 65 this year and a named owner on the deed? You qualify! Bring in your drivers license or ID for proof of age and we will assist you in the application.

#### **Senior Freeze Exemption**

•Are you 65 and have a total household income of less than \$65,000? You qualify! Bring in your current "Federal" income tax form and/or any forms you would normally take to have your income taxes done. If you meet the filing requirements, we will have the forms in our office after April 1st and can assist you in filling out the form.

#### **Disabled Veteran**

•Are you a Veteran with at least 30% service-connected disability through the Department of Veterans Affairs and a named owner on the deed? You qualify! Bring in a copy of your DD 214 as well as the proof of disability for the current year you are applying for that lists your percentage of disability and we will assist you in filling out the form.

If you have scheduled an appointment, please make sure to bring your child's car seat manual, as well as your vehicle's owner's manual with you.



Illinois law requires that all children under the age of 8 be properly restrained in an appropriate child safety seat and children under the age of 2 ride rear-facing. All children need to be restrained correctly whenever they ride in a motor vehicle...every trip, every time.

#### Child Passenger Safety Tips

- ♦ Keep children in rear-facing safety seats as long as possible.
- ♦ Keep children in the back seat at least through age 12.
- ♦ Never place a rear-facing safety seat in front of an active airbag.
- ♦ A used safety seat may not be safe unless you know the history of the seat and all labels, parts, and instructions are present.
- ♦ Always register your safety seat with the manufacturer so you can be notified of recalls.
- ♦ Do not use a safety seat that is more than six years old or past the expiration date stamped on the seat.
- ♦ Non-regulated products such as toys attached to the safety seat, mirrors, window shades, and belt-tightening tools are not recommended unless the safety seat manufacturer allows their use.
- ♦ All objects in the vehicle should be stowed in the trunk or tied down, as they can become projectiles if a crash or sudden stop occurs.

Keep your child safe in a car seat! Remember to register your car seat and sign up for recall notices to receive safety updates!

# UPCOMING TOWNSHIP ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS for 2024

Highway Commissioner Mike Smith has indicated that he will be concentrating on the following projects as construction season starts. With over 10 miles of tar and chipping and 2 miles of asphalt paving *tentatively* scheduled, it looks to be a busy summer.

#### Tar & chip

- O Corning Road from Cottage Grove to Yates Ave
